

Special Meeting
September 22, 2022

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, the special meeting was called to order at 5.00p by Mayor Vereide. Council present was Jahnke, Dickson, Williams and Rhoda. Others present were Emily Heenan, Hohni Weringa, Karen Osberg, Kandy Blondin, Vicki Boeckman, and Crystal Pfohl.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The purpose of this meeting was:

- To hold interviews with Emily Heenan and Hohni Weringa.
- To hold a public hearing on a variance as requested by Crystal Pfohl to construct a 6' high tall wooden fence on their property, which when completed will be over 3' high in the front(s). (Said house is located on a corner); and
- Stolen copper wire

INTERVIEWS

Using the point system, the Council held interviews with Emily Heenan and Hohni Weringa.

Following the interviews, it was moved by Dickson, seconded by Williams to offer the position to Hohni Weringa. All members present voted aye, motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING FOR PFOHL FENCE

The public hearing for the variance as requested by Crystal Pfohl to build a 6' high wooden fence upon her property known as 202 S. Henry Street which when completed will be taller than 3' high in the front.

Pfohl stated that the fence is needed to keep her dogs contained, that the posts are cemented in, it will be sanded and painted, it will be vinyl to east and north. There was concern expressed for the condition of the fence, whether the dogs are dangerous, the weeds that will grow around the fence, visibility, ducks/geese that are apparently on the property, all of the items in the yard(s). Mayor Vereide pointed out that the issue at hand is the variance for the fence only.

Following all comment, it was moved by Williams, seconded by Dickson to allow the variance as requested by Crystal Pfohl to install a 6' high fence on the north, east, and west sides of her properties which when completed will be over 3' high in the 'fronts' and a chain link fence on the south side of her property. Williams, Dickson, Jahnke, and Vereide voted aye; Rhoda voted against; motion carried.

As there was no further business, Mayor Vereide declared the meeting adjourned.
